

Solipsys 2008 Kaua'i Island Scholarship Contest Official Rules

1. All participants must currently reside on the island of Kaua'i and be enrolled in a Kaua'i elementary school, middle school, high school, private school, or home-school equivalent. Students ranging from first through twelfth grades are eligible to enter.
2. Entries will be received from 8:30 a.m. on Monday, November 3, 2008 until 4:00 p.m. on Wednesday, December 3, 2008. If entries are mailed, they must be in the hands of the judges on or before 4:00 p.m. December 3rd to be considered. Winners will be announced on or around Friday, December 19, 2008.
3. To enter the contest, eligible students can receive and submit an entry form in person, from their school, or at either Solipsys location on Kaua'i, or online at www.solipsys.com:

Registration should be completed when entries are submitted.

4. Entries may be submitted in person or by U.S. Mail. Electronic copies of written entries may also be submitted via e-mail to scholarship@solipsys.com. Entries delivered in person will be accepted Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. at either Solipsys location on Kaua'i. Please call the Solipsys location you plan to visit ahead of time if you register and/or enter in person.

5. Entry Requirements:

Grades 1-3:

Submit a poster that illustrates new opportunities to use technology in day to day work on the island or how technology is currently impacting work on Kaua'i. Posters should include descriptive text.

Grades 4-6:

Submit a 250-word or less essay that describes new opportunities to use technology in day to day work on the island or how technology is currently impacting work on Kaua'i.

Grades 7-9:

Submit a 350-word or less essay that describes new opportunities to use technology in day to day work on the island or how technology is currently impacting work on Kaua'i.

Grades 10-12:

Submit a 500-word or less essay that describes new opportunities to use technology in day to day work on the island or how technology is currently impacting work on Kaua'i.

The author of each poster/essay in each grade-level category that best articulates the contest theme will be awarded a \$275 cash grand prize, for a total of four grand prizes, the next best entry in each grade-level category will be awarded a \$150 second-place prize, and the third best entry in each grade-level category will be awarded a \$75 third-place prize. The grade-level categories are as follows: Grades 1-3, Grades 4-6, Grades 7-9, and Grades 10-12.

6. Factors taken into consideration by the judge(s) include, but are not limited to: creativity, vision, organization, relevance to theme, spelling and grammar with respect to each grade-level group.
7. The first 150 participants to submit their entries will receive an official Kaua`i Island Scholarship Contest T-Shirt. Eligible contestants will be notified by their school when awards are delivered to the school and distributed by the principal. Home schooled participants will be notified by Solipsys and may pick up their awards at either Solipsys location on Kaua`i.
8. Only one entry per participant will be accepted. If more than one is submitted, only the first will be considered.
